Jeremy Jernegan, is Chair of the Newcomb Art Department and head of the ceramics area in Studio Art. He received his MA and MFA degrees from San Jose State University in Fine Art / Ceramics. In addition to teaching and studio practice, he has been Programs Director and member of the executive board for the National Council on Education for the Ceramic Arts (NCECA) from 1998 – 2005, and Conference host in New Orleans in 1993-94.
